What's New in 2026

Introducing South Shore Waste Solutions



We are excited to share that the Lunenburg Regional Community Recycling Center has a new name — **South Shore Waste Solutions**.

This change comes as part of our effort to create an identity that better reflects the full range of services we provide today.

While recycling remains an important part of what we do, our work extends far beyond that, and our new name highlights our commitment to offering modern, sustainable waste solutions for our entire region. This helps protect our beautiful Nova Scotia environment and turns yesterday's trash into new resources for our communities.

Extended Producer Responsibility for Packaging, Paper Products, and Packaging-like Products

Extended Producer Responsibility for Packaging, Paper Products, and Packaging-like Products (or EPR for PPP) came into effect December 1, 2025. It shifts responsibility for curbside recycling programs from municipalities to the producers of packaging and paper products.

Under the new program, producers will have to meet recycling targets that, over time, will encourage more eco-friendly packaging and reduce single-use plastics.

Your Waste Collection Day Might Be Changing

To improve efficiency, waste collection routes in the District of Lunenburg will be changing in 2026. Currently, there are ten collection routes completed over a two-week period, Monday through Friday, with holiday collections taking place on Saturdays. Starting March 30, 2026, this will change to eight collection routes, completed Tuesday through Friday over a two-week period. Holiday collections will move to Mondays. These changes will be permanent.

- Current routes will remain in effect until March 27, 2026.
- New routes will take effect beginning March 30, 2026.

Waste collection begins at 7:00 a.m. on scheduled days. Please ensure all materials are placed at the roadside by that time.

Regular bi-weekly collection will continue to include:

- Green cart (organics)
- Paper and cardboard
- Recyclable containers
- Garbage
- Up to two bulky landfill items

Special collections—including fall wood and metal pickup, electronics and Christmas tree collection—will continue to be offered annually.

Christmas Tree Collection: Trees will be collected on your regular pickup day between January 5 - 16. Remove decorations and place trees roadside by 7 am on pickup day. Two trees collected, per house.

Electronic Products Recycling Association (EPRA) has added several types of electronics items for recycling:

- **Floor & carpet care appliances:** vacuums and carpet cleaners
- **Garment care appliances:** irons and steam cleaners
- **Counter-top cooking appliances:** food processors, coffee grinders, coffee makers
- **Devices for cutting food items & opening/sealing packages**
- **Time measurement devices & weight scales:** alarm clocks, wall clocks, food scales, weight scales
- **Personal care appliances:** hair dryers, electric toothbrushes
- **Portable air treatment devices:** portable fans, heaters, humidifiers (does not include air conditioners)

Battery Recycling Program: Recycling batteries keeps harmful chemicals out of the environment, prevents waste facility fires and ensures they are made into new batteries.



Accepted Products:

- A, AA, AAA, C, D and 9-volt batteries
- Button and coin batteries (used in hearing aids, watches, musical greeting cards)
- Rechargeable battery packs from power tools (under 5 kgs)
- E-bike and E-scooter batteries

Products Not Accepted:

- Batteries over 5 kgs (including car and forklift batteries)

How to Recycle Batteries:

1. **Collect** - store in a glass or plastic container.
2. **Protect** - tape off the terminals of all lithium, rechargeable and alkaline batteries over 9V and all button/coin batteries.
3. **Deliver** - take to an approved drop off location (at least every 3 months to avoid corrosion).

Winter Green Cart Tips

- ✓ Put your cart out for collection every two weeks. Large carts can hold up to 250 lbs. Carts over this weight will not be emptied.
- ✓ Cool stove ashes completely before putting them in the cart, to prevent damage and fires.
- ✓ Line your cart with paper leaf bags or cardboard so contents slide out easily when frozen.



Lightbulb Recycling Program

Bulbs Accepted:

- Compact fluorescent lights (CFLs)
- Fluorescent tubes
- Halogen & incandescent bulbs
- Light-emitting diodes (LEDs)
- UV and germicidal bulbs
- Miniature bulbs
- High-intensity discharge (HID) & special purpose bulbs

Items not Accepted: light ballasts, light fixtures, string lights and Christmas lights.

Items Not Collected Curbside:
Hazardous waste, paint, propane tanks, batteries, lightbulbs, fridges, air conditioners and asphalt shingles.

Bulky Landfill Collection: Two items can be collected on your collection day, year-round. Items may weigh up to 100 kgs (220 lbs) and measure up to 1.8 m (6 feet). Accepted items include: couches, mattresses, box springs, plastic furniture, toilets, windows, vinyl siding, artificial Christmas trees and plastic toys.

Wood and metal items are collected during a special fall collection only, not bi-weekly. Questions? Call 902-543-2991 or visit www.southshorewaste.ca.



Clear Bags are used for curbside garbage collection in the District of Lunenburg to improve waste collectors' safety and to keep recyclables, organics and hazardous waste out of landfill.

Each household, apartment or business can put out one non-transparent (black, green or white) bag curbside, every two weeks. Waste inside clear bags must be loose and not contained within other bags. Questions? Call 902-543-2991.

Summer Green Cart Tips: Reduce Odour & Pests

- ✓ Put your cart out every collection. Food waste will spend less time breaking down; this will decrease odour.
 - ✓ Use a paper leaf and yard waste bag to line your cart. Roll the bag shut to contain odours. You can also line your cart with cardboard.
 - ✓ Wrap meat and bones in newspaper. Put wet or oily foods in cereal boxes and put them in the cart.
 - ✓ Store your cart in the shade to slow the breakdown of food waste.

Public Event Sorting Bins: South Shore Waste Solutions lends sorting bins for public and private events. Bins are labelled with signs. Book in advance by calling 902-543-2991. Event organizers are responsible for waste disposal afterward.



Bears & Waste Storage: When bears come into a residential area they're usually looking for food. Being careful how you handle food waste can minimize odours which could attract bears. Bears can smell food odours coming from green carts and garbage containers; they consider this a food source and will return again. Bears can smell food over one kilometer away.

What Can You Do: Store green carts and bagged waste in a shed until pickup day. Put carts and bags out on the morning of pickup. Clean your green cart with a solution of one part bleach to nine parts water after every pickup. Freeze food scraps and put them in your cart the morning of pickup.

Used Oil Recycling Program: residents can drop off used oil, oil filters, glycol (antifreeze) and oil jugs, glycol and DEF at South Shore Waste Solutions at 908 Mullock Road, Whynot's Settlement for free.

Leaf & Yard Waste is collected year-round, on regular collection days. A maximum of 3 bags or bundles of branches can be collected when your green cart is curbside, and 4 bags or bundles collected when your cart isn't curbside. **Paper leaf bags must be used. Branches: must be bundled and tied.** Branches up to 3 feet long and 2 inches in diameter are accepted; 55 lbs per bundle. Questions? Call 902-543-2991.

Paper items and recyclable containers go in separate bags: paper items are processed separately from recyclable containers. Do not mix paper and containers together in the same they will be rejected.

Wood & Metal Collection takes place once a year. Wood and metal will be picked up on your collection day between September 29 – October 9.
Tancook Islands: collection will take place September 30 and October 7.
 Each household/ business can put out a combined volume of 4 cubic metres. Remove spikes and brackets larger than 6 inches from wood. **Place wood and metal in separate piles.**

Curbside Giveaway: September 12 - 13
 Give away your reusable items -- keep them out of landfill. Put a "FREE" sign on your items. Put them along the roadside, avoid blocking vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Curbside Electronics Collection: Each household can put out three electronics on their regular collection day between October 13 – 23.

Tancook Islands Electronics Collection: October 14 & 21.

Always Secure Your Load: Use a tarp or netting to contain small items and bagged waste when you deliver them to the waste site. Larger, heavier items must be firmly secured with straps, rope or netting.

Test the load to see if it moves before you start driving and keep an eye on the load while you're driving.

Spread out a tarp on the bottom of your truck bed or trailer to contain small pieces. **Unsecured loads can create roadside litter and cause accidents. Nails and screws can cause flat tires.**

Safe Sharps Program: Safely dispose of needles and lancets. Pick up a free sharps container at your local pharmacy. Place your used sharps in the Safe Sharps container. When the container is *almost* full, seal the lid, return it to your community pharmacy. **Consider Waste Collectors' Safety: Do not put sharps in garbage or blue bags.**



Recycle Your Tires: You can return up to four used tires for recycling at any time, to any tire retailer in Nova Scotia, free of charge. Tires must be off the rim and free of mud. You Can Prevent Illegal Dumping: Always ask your contractor, roofer or waste hauler for proof of responsible disposal. Request a copy of the disposal receipt from South Shore Waste Solutions, along with your bill.

Report It: For more information or to report illegal dumping, call (902) 543-2991. Anyone charged with dumping may face a minimum Summary Offense Ticket of \$250, up to a maximum of \$5,000.

Waste Collection Reminders:

- * Put your waste out by 7 am on collection day to ensure pickup.
- * Place your waste within 10 feet of the road.
- * Call 1-855-530-3324 if your waste hasn't been collected.
- * Remove any rejected waste or litter from your collection spot before the end of the day.

RECYCLABLES - BLUE BAG

Rinse & Dry Recyclables

Glass, lids & caps OFF: clear and coloured glass, food containers, jars and bottles. Cosmetic containers, spice bottles, oil & vinegar bottles
No broken glass—place in a box, labelled “broken glass”, place beside garbage bags.

Lids & caps ON for the following:

Plastic jugs and bottles: laundry detergent & household cleaner jugs, shampoo, body wash, salad dressing, dish soap, mouth wash

Plastic trays and containers: food trays, salad, yogurt, peanut butter, muffin and egg containers

Paper cartons: dairy & dairy substitute cartons, molasses cartons, laundry & cleaning cartons, soup & sauce cartons and coffee cartons

Multi-layer paper containers: Spiral wound containers for frozen juice, chips, cookie dough, cups and bowls, ice cream containers and paper coffee cups

Plastic tubes: toothpaste tubes, roll-on deodorant tubes and hand cream tubes. *Ensure items are empty.*

Other plastic packaging: candy dispensers, small toy packaging, sanitizer bottles & pumps, pails, garden pots and seedling trays

Flexible plastic (film): Plastic that

can be stretched. Bags - dry cleaning bags, bread, newspapers and flyers. Sandwich & freezer bags shrink wrap.

Metal packaging: food cans, metal lids, candle, cookie, coffee and tea tins and wire hangers

Other aluminum packaging: aluminum foil, pie plates, yogurt/sour cream seals, frozen food trays and tea light candle holders

DELIVER TO A PARTICIPATING ENVIRO DEPOT

Laminated plastics: chip bags, candy & snack wrappers, coffee & deli pouches, cereal liner bags and gift bags

Non-hazardous aerosol containers: food spray, hairspray, air fresheners, shaving cream, deodorant, wax and polish spray, insulating foam

Flexible & rigid foam (polystyrene): meat trays, packing peanuts, take-out containers, cups, plates, bowls and foam packaging

PAPER - BLUE BAG

Papers: loose paper, notepads, file folders and other printed materials

Newspapers & magazines: newspapers, flyers, brochures, glossy & non-glossy magazines

Catalogues & telephones books: catalogues, phone books and directories

PAPER - BLUE BAG

Paper gift wrapping & decorations: greeting cards, envelopes, gift wrapping & boxes, tissue paper and paper decorations

Boxboard: cereal, tissue & shoe boxes, clothing tags, egg cartons, toilet paper & paper towel rolls

Paper bags (kraft paper): Any colour, including flour bags, prescription bags and paper produce bags. *Do not include waxed or parchment paper bags: place in green cart.*

Multi-layer paper packaging: pet food bags, muffin, burger, sandwich wraps

Boxboard: cereal, tissue or shoe boxes, clothing tags, egg cartons, toilet paper and paper towel rolls

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Pizza boxes, direct mail boxes and moving boxes

Important: Containers, bottles and plastic packaging go in one bag and paper items go in a separate bag. They will be rejected if mixed together in the same bag.

ORGANICS - GREEN CART

- All food waste and table scraps
 - Meat, fish & bones, shellfish, including shells
 - Fruit and vegetables
 - Dairy products, pasta and bread
 - Coffee filters, coffee grounds, tea bags and waxed paper
 - Paper towels, paper napkins, tissues and wet paper
 - Hair and pet fur
 - Sawdust and wood shavings (not pressure treated)
 - Leaves, plants and twigs (max. 2 inches in diameter and 3 feet long)
 - Ashes from woodstove, **must be cold**
- Plastic-type compostable bags are not permitted in green carts.** Use paper liners, boxboard or cardboard to line your cart or mini bin instead.

GARBAGE - CLEAR BAG

One black bag allowed per household, per collection day

- Coffee pods
- Pet waste, kitty litter & dog waste bags
- **Soiled** plastic wrap and plastic bags
- Popcorn bags
- Dishes, glasses and broken glass containers. *Put in a sealed box, labelled “broken glass”, place beside garbage bags*
- Clothing and footwear (also donate)
- Gloves, masks and face shields
- Sanitary products, diapers and wipes
- Carbon paper
- Floor sweepings, vacuum bags, string, textiles and dryer lint

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE:

Drop off at South Shore Waste Solutions, 908 Mullock Road, Whyntott's Settlement

- Batteries: alkaline, rechargeable & lithium
- Lights: fluorescent, LED, CFL, high-intensity discharge lamps & incandescent bulbs
- Leftover corrosive cleaners
- Pesticides & herbicides
- Used oil and glycol
- Solvents, thinners & flammables
- Aerosol cans, propane tanks & propane cylinders
- Cans of unused paint and stain
